"This is what we do everyday and we know what a powerful impact receiving new clothing has on people who need it, even when they don't have a brand new house to go with it. Kids feel better about going to school and adults often become more confident and regain their self-respect. When you feel good about yourself, you have a much better chance to succeed. It's a privilege to help parents and families accomplish this."

Diane Korman, Senior Producer with the show said that *Extreme Makeover: Home Edition* would be nothing without the volunteers that step up to help strangers in need. "It starts with our Builder, *Heritage Homes of Mobile*, who waived their fees and worked for free. Every nail, every stick of wood, every piece of furniture is donated. We recognize and appreciate community, where love and goodness is generated and contagious to the 20 million Americans who watch the show every week and then pay-it forward in their own neighborhoods. It just goes to show, when you ask people for help, companies like Dignity U Wear make the impossible possible. We can not thank them enough."

Diehl stated that Dignity U Wear would be very interested in working with ABC again "if it makes sense and we have the appropriate inventory to meet the needs of other families. This was a great experience all the way around," he added.

Extreme Makeover: Home Edition, which has won back-to-back Emmy Awards as Best Reality Program (non-competitive), is in its 5th season on ABC. The program is produced by Endemol USA, a division of Endemol Holding. Denise Cramsey is the executive producer; and David Goldberg is the president of Endemol USA.

Dignity U Wear was founded in 2000 and distributes brand new clothing it receives from manufacturers and retailers through a network of 311 recipient nonprofit agencies in 30 states. Locally, the organization has donated more than \$20 million of brand new clothing through 70 Northeast Florida-area nonprofits. Nationally, the organization has provided more than 4.4 million pieces, valued at \$71 million, to more than 350,000 people.

The organization does not receive any city, state or federal government grants or funding; it operates exclusively on private donations from individuals, corporations and private foundations. Volunteers help process 100% of the incoming inventory, providing 95% of the time and labor necessary to accomplish the task.
